Point Loma Rotary Club Serves the Community

The PLRC has engaged in several community service activities during the past few months. The effort reflects our ongoing commitment to the Rotary motto "Service Above Self."

Heading the list are contributions made to aid with hurricane relief in Gulf Coast states devastated by Hurricane Katrina. This storm startled the nation with its fury as it swept through the Gulf of Mexico and hammered parts of the American South. New Orleans in particular suffered serious flood damage as a result of numerous breaches of storm-weakened levees.

A number of PLRC members have families living in the New Orleans area, including **Rich Stakelum** who has since made several trips to Louisiana. During those visits he assisted with hurricane relief at the behest of the San Diego Rescue Task Force. He also served as a guide to RTF members to help navigate past the physical hurdles that resulted from storm damage.

Earlier this month Rich briefed club members about his travels and showed photos of the devastation. He stressed the importance of rebuilding New Orleans and opined that it is a national imperative.

While in Louisiana Rich delivered funds drawn from the club's Community Service budget—i.e., from the Endowment Fund—to the Plaquesmines Rotary Club. The money will be used to help with various recovery efforts. The club also contributed to hurricane relief via the Rescue Task Force, the Humane

Society, and the American Red Cross.

Regarding other Community Service news, on Veterans Day, November 11th, Boy Scouts of America Troop 24 presented the colors and led the Pledge of Allegiance to open the club meeting. **Dick Thorn** serves as assistant troop leader; his son **Pavel** is a troop member and he participated in the presentation. PLRC President **Byron Dyck** gave Troop 24 a check from Community Service funds.

Club Service Director Nat Webster is interacting with Christina Gonzales of the Point Loma Library to provide books for our guest speakers to sign. These books are then donated to the children's section of the library. Again, Community Service funds have been provided to Ms. Gonzales to purchase the books.

During the Board of Directors meeting in October, Board members unanimously approved the Community Service budget. This acceptance paves the way for the foregoing contributions as well as many others that will be made throughout the Rotary year.

We have received periodic updates regarding construction of the new Shelter Island Rotary Pavilion. Current PLRC President-elect and past Community Service Director **Pete Hedley** has been heavily involved with planning for the construction. Architect and current Vocational Service Director **Dan Johnston** worked with Pete and the San Diego Port District as part of the effort. For its part, the Port District requested PLRC funding to be applied to Phase One of the construction plan

Membership Notes By George Klein

Rotary Wheel

A wheel has been the symbol of Rotary since our earliest days. The first design was made by Montague Bear, a Chicago Rotarian, who drew a simple wagon wheel with a few lines to show dust and motion. Although there is no official significance to the wheel, most of the early clubs had some form of wagon wheel on their publications and letterheads.

In 1922 it was decided that all Rotary clubs should adopt a single design as the exclusive emblem. The present gear wheel, with 24 cogs and six spokes, was adopted by Rotary International. A group of engineers pointed out that the gear wheel was mechanically unsound and would not work without a keyway in the center of the gear to attach it to a power shaft. So, in 1923 the keyway was added, and the design which we now know was formally adopted as the official Rotary International emblem.
