2004-05: Year of Achievements for Point Loma Rotary Club

Membership Picture Improves; Comedy Night Fundraiser Nets Highest Total to Date

Under President **David Pettigrew's** leadership, Rotary year 2004-05 proved to be a year of notable achievements for the Point Loma Rotary Club. In particular, for the first time in five years, the PLRC experienced a net gain in membership. Also, the club's annual Comedy Cavalcade netted the highest fundraising proceeds thus far in the four-year old event.

Membership

The club began the Rotary year with 40 members on the roll. The net result of these gains and losses is a membership total of 44. Six new members—Bob Baker (transferee from the La Mesa club), Tony Calabrese (transferee from the San Diego Downton Club), Larry Brenner, Claudia Low, Mark Nokes, and Mike Nelson—joined the club. On the other side of the ledger, Valerie Fido-Moore resigned and, sadly, longtime member Merrill "Dad" Day passed away early in 2005.

To round out the year, club members enjoyed a field trip to the San Diego Maritime Museum and made a \$4,000 donation in the late "Dad" Day's name to the upkeep of the organization's vessel *Star of India*. Members also participated in the annual Christmas caroling event at St. Paul's Manor in Hillcrest.

The annual Christmas Party, held during the last club meeting of the calendar year, continued to be a big hit for children. Moreover, the club enjoyed its annual "Galapalooza Club Joke-a-thon," in which every club member was tasked—at least in theory—to tell a joke.



was able to contribute the entire net proceeds of \$9,500 to the Injured Marine Semper Fi Fund.

The club will continue to use this event to support its annual fundraising efforts. However, the club leadership is committed to developing other fundraising efforts to augment that of the Comedy Cavalcade.

Club Service

Southwestern Yacht Club continued to host club meetings. Quarterly dues remained at \$185. As always, the club is grateful for the number of Rotarians who do makeups at the PLRC—particularly those from the San Diego Rotary Club (Downtown)—as their attendance helps to offset some of the meal costs.

Director Judy Byram efficiently carried out her responsibilities for the week-by-week operations of the club. Under her purview, **Dave Leedom**, who relieved **Rich Stakelum** early in the year, administered the weekly raffle. A recent estimate indicates the activity added between \$900 and \$1,000 to the club's endowment fund.

Judy also remained in her role as club photographer, an important one in the production of the club's newsletter, *The RotaPoint*. Her photos always add significantly to the content of each issue.

Equally important, **Dave Leedom** made a significant contribution to the newsletter by setting up and managing the electronic distribution of each issue to those members who have online capabilities. His effort reduced the expense of printing and mailing from an annual budget of \$775 to just \$272, with the prospect of even a greater reduction in cost in the coming year.

Club members enjoyed two social affairs, spearheaded by social chair **Sharon Bythewood**. On October 1st, **Shannon** and **Ken Osborne** reprised their roles of last year as hosts of the annual "Oktoberfest." "Sausage King" **Bill Cole** grilled the various wursts that highlighted the meal. The calendar year ended on a sparkling note with a holiday party at the home of **Mary-Kay**

and **Byron Dyck** on December 18th. **Community Service**

Director Pete Hedley extended his tenure in order to provide ongoing continuity as the PLRC sustained its multi-faceted support for the Point Loma community as well as the San Diego community at large. Pete also continued to serve as the principal club liaison with the Port District in laying out the new Rotary pavilion project on Shelter Island.

Replacement of the condemned pavilion has been a major longterm effort. It is an ongoing activity that has carried over for several Rotary years and is the club's Rotary Centennial project. In March 2005 the club contributed \$10,000 to the Port District in support of the project. Construction is expected to be completed in the Fall of 2005.

Vocational Service

Director Dan Johnston presided over various activities aimed at helping Point Loma teens. As always, the purpose is to help them gain a greater awareness of Rotary, to give them a better idea of club projects, and perhaps most importantly, to provide them with opportunities to interact with Rotarians. For example, the club contributed \$1,200 to the annual Rotary Youth Leadership Award (RYLA) camp at Idyllwild, which

hosts teens from schools around Southern California.

On February 11, 2005, Vocational Service sponsored a Four-Way Test speech competition—emceed by **Dave DeRosier**—at the club level for students from both High Tech High School and Point Loma High School. Dan continued to draw on the help of local Toastmasters to work with the students in creating after-school speech programs and gavel clubs during academic year 2004-05.

Unfortunately, no Interact clubs were active in either High Tech High or Point Loma High School during the Rotary year, although prospects for the establishment of such clubs at each school are improving. Also, a Point Loma Nazarene University representative has approached the PLRC about establishing a Rotaract club.

International Service

Director Gary Stephany managed the club's international service activities during the year. Thanks to his effort, the club participated in a Matching Grant program that generated about \$6,000 for a clean water project in Africa.

A Renewed Commitment

As the curtain lowers on Rotary year 2004-05, club members should feel reasonably assured that past accomplishments will be sustained in the 2005-06 term. The new year offers members opportunities to renew their commitments to the club's goals. Moreover, each is called upon to renew his or her faith in the importance of serving both the club and the local and worldwide communities.
